This is an update on the Cypress Isles Neighborhood Watch Alert from May on the coyote sighting:



The same security camera recently captured a small pack of 3 coyotes wandering the neighborhood after dark. Another neighbor in the 600 block of Spring Islands Way also saw the pack of 3.

In Case You Missed It

Ripped from the pages of WLCA's eBlast on 2/3/23, which had been ripped from the pages of the Orange County Solid Waste guide...here it is:

Orange County Recycler

Do you know what to do with your packaging? Follow this Orange County Solid Waste guide for tips and tricks to dispose of your items properly.

- Cardboard Boxes: Flatten and place in the blue lid recycling cart.
- Styrofoam and Packing Peanuts: Place in the green lid garbage cart.
- Air Pillows, Bubble Wrap, and Padded Envelopes: To recycle, please visit http://www.PlasticFilmRecycling.org to find a drop-off location near you!

Curbside collection done right:

- Place carts within three feet of the curb no earlier than 6 PM the night before and no later than 6 AM on collection day.
- Keep carts three feet away from mailboxes, parked cars, and low-hanging tree limbs.
- Keep lids fully closed; do not overfill carts.
- Have three feet of clearance between carts so trucks can safely use the mechanical arm.
- Face cart handles toward the house and lid arrows towards the street.
- After collection, put empty carts away on the same day.

Epilogue:

All those ripped pages have been placed into the blue recycling bin.





So, What Is a WLCA eBlast?

...and how can I get it?

I'm glad you asked. WLCA broadcasts current news such as traffic construction, building updates, social events, bus trips, committee info, board meeting notices with ZOOM invites, meeting minutes, and other happenings in Waterford Lakes using eBlasts. If you are not already registered for WLCA eBlasts, here's how you can register:

Go to http://www.mywaterfordlakes.org > Login > Login Resident Form.

Go to "My Account", then click on "Settings"; look at the list of email notifications; in the block next to each item using the pull-down menu, indicate which ones you want to receive and how often. The choices are "Immediately", "Daily", "Weekly", & "Don't Notify".

When you've indicated your preferences for email notification, click the blue box "UPDATE" at the bottom.

Follow the same procedure if you wish to receive Text Message Notifications or Mobile App Notifications

Your information is not used for anything except eBlasts, and registration includes protection against being spammed.

Save the Date, Save the Daylight!



It's just around the corner and will be here before you can say "Oh Bleep, we gotta change all the clocks aGAIN..."

Daylight Saving Time in the United States will begin at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday March 12th. Set your clocks ahead 1 hour so you won't be late for stuff. If you do it on Saturday, you won't have to stay up until 2:00 AM to make the change. ©
