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Who's Responsible for Sidewalks?

It depends. Different people have different responsibilities.

Sidewalks are great except when someone trips or slips and falls because of a sidewalk issue. That's when the injured party sues the association and our liability premiums rise. (Also, don't forget that the injured party was injured, which shouldn't happen to anyone.)

Property owners and Orange County are each responsible for sidewalks, <u>not the HOA</u>. Orange County is responsible for new sidewalks and sidewalk repairs for safety concerns.

Property owners are responsible for keeping sidewalks clean and (especially) free of slimy, slippery buildups, so nobody slips and falls. Owners are also responsible for reporting any trip hazards such as sections that are pushed up by roots of nearby trees. If a section is raised more than an inch higher than the next section, report the problem to Orange County by calling 311 on your cell phone or dialing (407) 836-3111 on your landline.



Cypress Isles 2024 Operating Budget

Assessments will go up 7.4% after nine years of near-zero increases.



On September 19th the Cypress Isles Board of Directors approved a \$31,920 operating budget for 2024 with homeowner assessments of \$58.00 per quarter, a 7.4% increase from 2023. The increase was needed after 9 years of near-zero increases.

The operating budget is shown on some other page and posted on the Cypress Isles website. Noteworthy changes are described below.

UTILITIES

Electric-General = \$1,800 (\$3.21 per quarter, up 28.1%). Electric service is 6.4% higher than the anticipated end-of-year value, but lower than last year's 15% jump.

MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS

Landscape Contract = \$11,530 (\$20.58 per quarter, up 13.7%). The cost increase reflects a new contract with Grasshoppers, replacing our previously underperforming contractor.

Aquatic Weed Control = \$1,200 (\$2.14 per quarter, down 6%). The contract was under budget this year but we anticipate a cost increase in the December contract renewal.

GENERAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE

Management Fee = \$8,760 (\$15.64 per quarter, up 2.1%). increases by \$15 per month. Last year Towers agreed to split the proposed \$30 monthly rate increase over the two years, so it went from \$700 to \$715 per month in 2023 and from \$715 to \$730 per month in 2024.

Storage Fee = \$36, (\$0.06 per quarter, up 178%). Storage was underestimated in 2023, now increased to the 2023 end-of-year projected value. This was a large percentage jump in a small actual cost.

Postage & Delivery = \$443 (\$0.79 per quarter, down 45%). This was sharply reduced because violation notices are sent out by WLCA, not Towers.

Copies & Printing = \$275 (\$0.49 per quarter, down 32%). This was sharply reduced because violation notices are sent out by WLCA, not Towers.

Office Supplies = \$965 (\$1.72 per quarter, up 209%). The increase reflects changes in Florida statutes that require HOAs to submit sworn notarized affidavits with each delinquent account, done after the Intent-to-Liens (ITLs) go out and before they expire. WLCA has the same onerous requirements.

Community Events = \$100 (\$0.18 per quarter, down 50%). The budget is reduced to reflect fewer new homeowner Welcome Gifts in a slowing housing market. The anticipated 2023 end-of-year total for this category is \$32.

RESERVE CONTRIBUTIONS

Pooled Reserves = \$583 (\$1.04 per quarter). This new line item is the start of a multi-year plan to replenish our reserves following a \$7,000 expense to refurbish the signage at our four entrances.

Water Restrictions

No, they haven't gone away...

This article is a rerun for the benefit of new neighbors who may not know this info, and for some of us old-timers who may forget! ©



We are still under the same Orange County mandatory water restrictions that were implemented in 2008. As a reminder of what that means:

- Water only if necessary and not between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
- Water in accordance with the following irrigation schedule:

Time of year	Homes with odd-numbered addresses	Homes with even-numbered addresses
Standard Time November 6, 2022 to March 10, 2024	Saturday only	Sunday only
Daylight Saving Time March 10, 2024 to November 3, 2024	Wednesday & Saturday	Thursday & Sunday

BOTTOM LINE:

NO WATERING on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday.

NO WATERING between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on your designated day, or ANY day.

Odd numbered houses may water on Saturday all year, and also on Wednesday during Daylight Saving Time (March 12 – November 5, 2023)

Even numbered houses may water on Sunday all year, and also on Thursday during Daylight Saving Time (March 12 – November 5, 2023).

The exceptions to these rules are newly planted sod (30 days); and "watering in" fertilizer or chemicals within 24 hours of application, but still not between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
